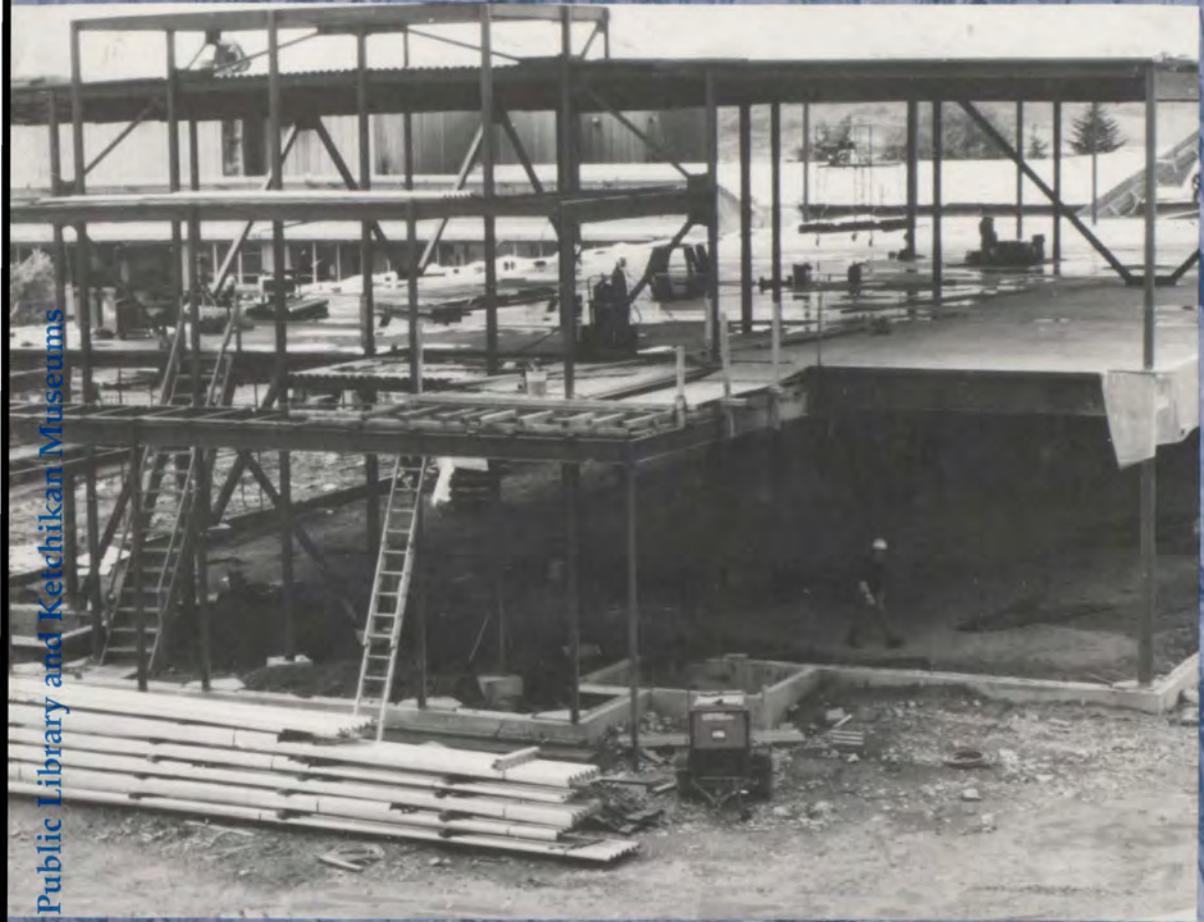

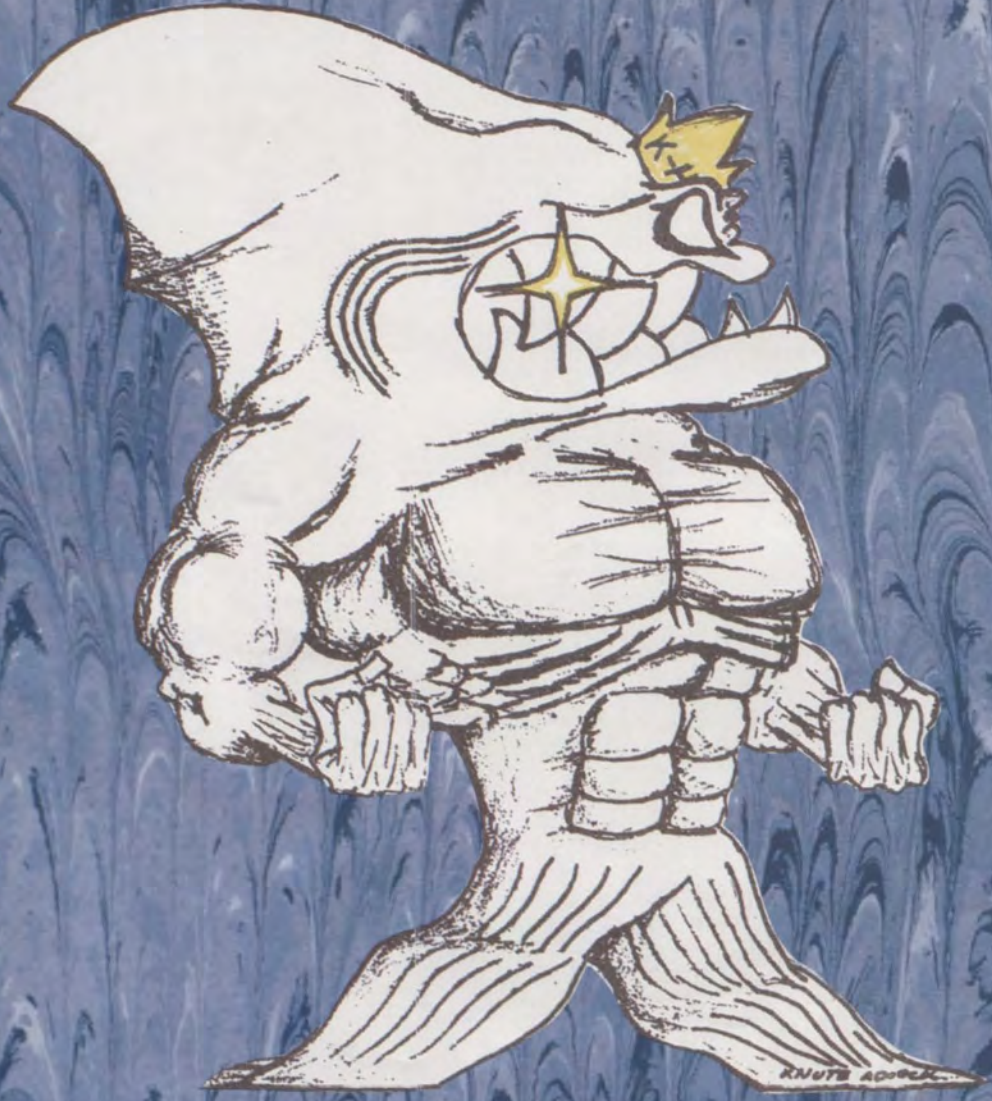
Though we may at times look as though we're at the end of our ropes you can rest assured that we are having the times of our lives, even if it kills us!

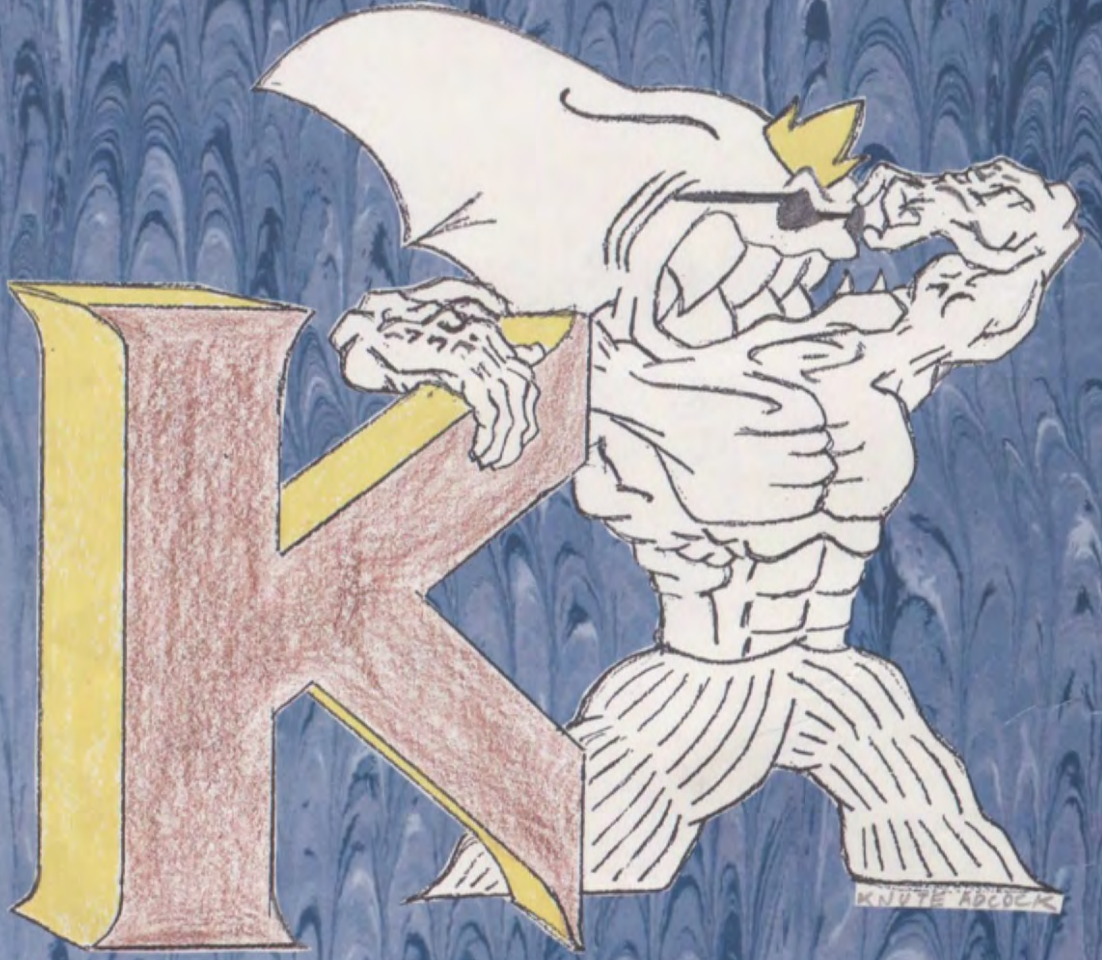

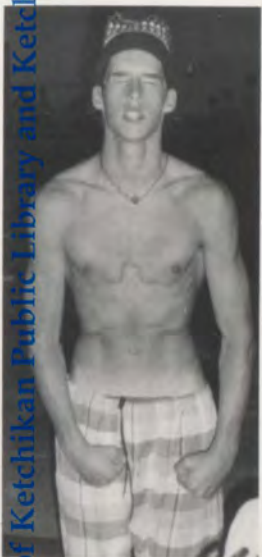

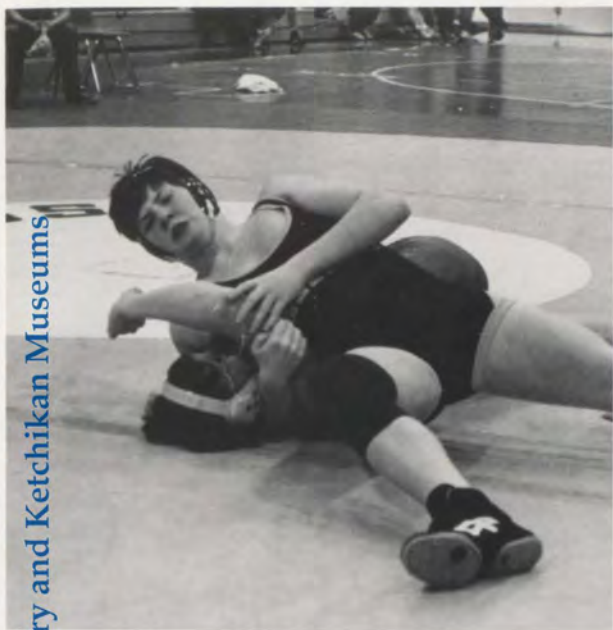

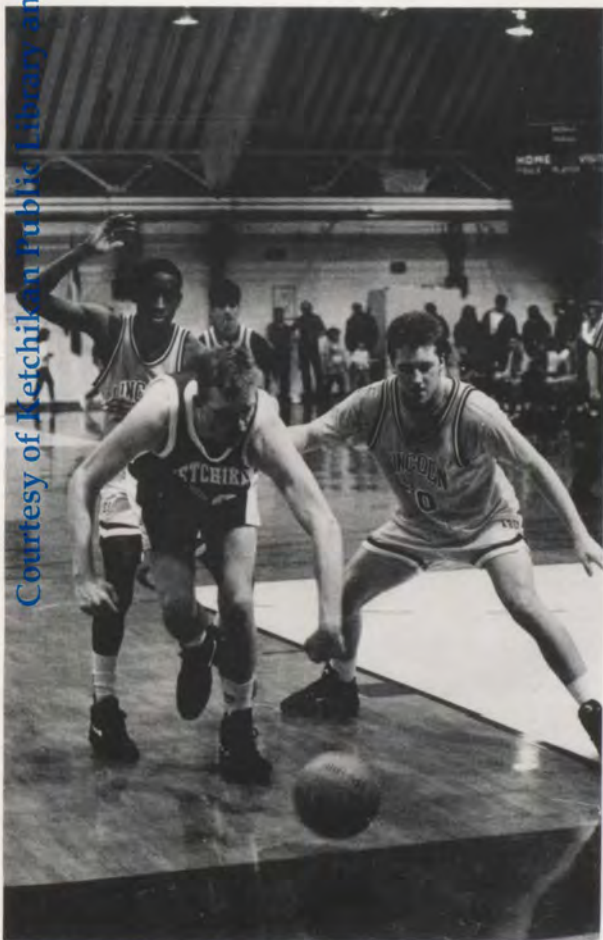

## COMPUTERS MAKE LIFE EASIER



June of 1992 saw the installation of a new automated library system into the school library. 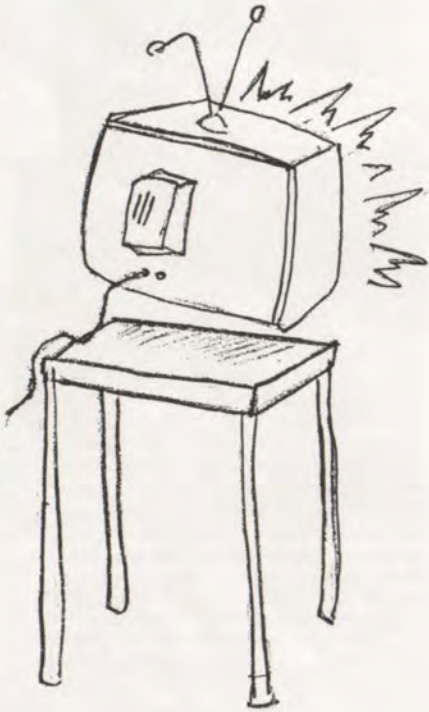

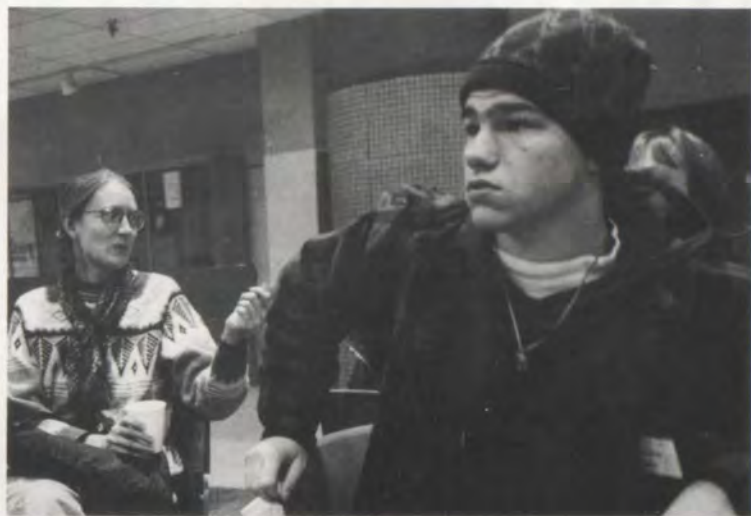

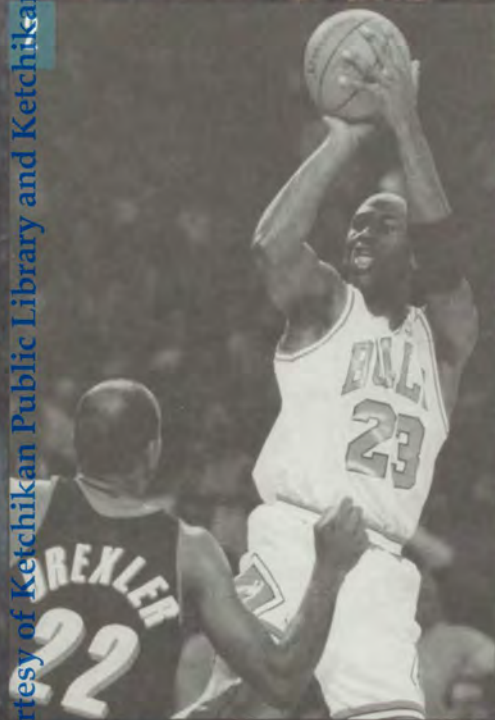
